

## SCIENCE FUN!

### Daffodils

The dependable, spring-flowering daffodil is a favorite for its long life and carefree, colorful blooms. Other common names include jonquil and narcissus.

### About This Plant

Daffodils bring cheer to the spring garden with abundant flowers in hues of yellow, white, pink, and salmon. Varieties are available in a range of sizes and forms. Flowers may be single or double, grow singly on a stem or with multiple flowers per stem, and height varies from 6 to 20 inches. Daffodils grow best in areas with cold winters, cool springs, and cool summers. Choose varieties that mature at different times to extend the bloom season. Unlike many spring-flowering bulbs, daffodil bulbs are not eaten by mice or moles.

#### **Special Features**

Easy care/low maintenance Multiplies readily Good for cut flowers

#### Site Selection

Select a site with full sun to light shade and well-drained soil.

#### **Planting Instructions**

Plant daffodil bulbs in fall, 6 to 8 weeks before a hard frost is expected and when soils are below 60 degrees F. This is usually during September and October in the North, and October and November in the South. Prepare the garden bed by using a garden fork or tiller to loosen the soil to a depth of 12 to 15 inches, then mix in a 2- to 4-inch layer of compost. Dig a hole about 3 to 4 times as deep as the height of the bulb. Set the bulb in the hole, pointy end up, then cover with soil and press firmly. Space bulbs 4 to 6 inches apart. Water thoroughly after planting.

### **Best Brownies**


#### Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease and flour an 8 inch square pan.
- 2. In a large saucepan, melt 1/2 cup butter. Remove from heat, and stir in sugar, eggs, and 1 teaspoon vanilla. Beat in 1/3 cup cocoa, 1/2 cup flour, salt, and baking powder. Spread batter into prepared pan.
- 3. Bake in preheated oven for 25 to 30 minutes. Do not overcook.
- To Make Frosting: Combine 3 tablespoons butter, 3 tablespoons cocoa, 1 tablespoon honey, 1 teaspoon vanilla, and 1 cup confectioners' sugar. Frost brownies while they are still warm.

## WHAT DO YOU DO - FIRE FIGHTER?

The primary function of a Firefighter is to protect the community from disaster situations, including house and building fires, and promote an environment of public safety.

This position also participates in fire prevention and inspection activities, equipment and guarters maintenance, and training dealing with all phases of fire suppression, prevention, inspection, rescue, and emergency operation.

Essential Functions are not intended to be an exhaustive list of all responsibilities, duties and skills. They are intended to be accurate summaries of what the job classification involves and what is required to perform it. Employees are responsible for all other duties as assigned.

- Responds to fire alarms and extinguishes fire
- Responds to calls for emergency medical services, and renders first aid;
- Performs salvage operations such as throwing salvage covers, sweeping water and removing debris;
- Responds to and renders assistance in emergency cases;
- Cleans and inspects equipment and apparatus after returning from a fire;
- Inspects equipment and apparatus and notifies superior officer of any defects:
- Makes minor repairs to equipment and apparatus, performs routine preventative maintenance tasks, and keeps records of such action;
- Keeps fire station, equipment and grounds in a clean and orderly condition;
- Participates in training activities and instruction sessions;
- Acquires and retains a thorough knowledge of the City, including streets, buildings, water supply, unusual hazards and related items;
- Performs various public information or education tasks;
- Enters inspection, training and (on occasion) fire and emergency medical service calls into the records management systems;
- Performs all work duties and activities in accordance with City policies and procedures
- Works in a safe manner and reports unsafe activity and conditions.
- Follows City-wide safety policy and practices and adheres to responsibilities concerning safety prevention, reporting and monitoring as outlined in the City's Safety Handbook.










## CRAFT FUN

#### Materials:

- a printer,
- a piece of paper....
- some crayons, paint, markers, or pencil crayons,
- scissors, glue.

#### **Optional materials:**

- fun foam.
- something hard as a base (a margarine container lid or cardboard from a cereal box work well).
- sparkle glue or sparkles.
- Ribbon, string, or wool

### **Craft Instructions:**

- Print out the template of choice.
- Color (where appropriate) and cut out the template pieces.
- There is a left and right mitten, decoration (piece with hearts and snowflake) and cuff (striped piece).
- You can color the decorations with sparkle glue or sparkles if desired.
- If you want, you can trace the left and right mitten template pieces onto a piece of fun foam to make a more permanent craft. Or you can glue the mitten template pieces to a hard base (cardboard).
- Glue the left decoration and right decoration onto the left mitten and right mitten respectively.
- Glue the left cuff and right cuff onto the left mitten and right mitten respectively.
- At this point, you can either:
- Attach one end of a string, ribbon or wool to each mitten so you can hang on the Christmas tree (either by poking a hole in the base and threading the string through or by attaching well with tape). It looks like the mittens little kids wear so they don't lose them.










## ABOUT YOUR HEALTH & BODY

### What is a Cold?

Between sniffles and sneezes or perhaps a sore throat and annoying cough, the common cold catches all of us from time to time.

With kids getting as many as eight colds per year or more, this contagious viral infection of the upper respiratory tract is the most common infectious disease in the United States and the No. 1 reason kids visit the doctor and stay home from school.

#### Causes

Most colds are caused by rhinoviruses that are in invisible droplets in the air we breathe or on things we touch. More than 100 different rhinoviruses can infiltrate the protective lining of the nose and throat, triggering an immune system reaction that can cause a sore throat and headache, and make it hard to breathe through the nose.



Air that is dry — indoors or out — can lower resistance to infection by the viruses that cause colds. Being a smoker or being around someone who's smoking can also lower resistance. People who smoke are more likely to catch a cold than people who don't — and their symptoms probably will be worse, last longer, and are more likely to lead to bronchitis or even pneumonia.

But despite some old wives' tales, not wearing a jacket or sweater when it's chilly, sitting or sleeping in a draft, and going outside while your hair is wet do not cause colds.

#### Signs and Symptoms

The first symptoms of a cold are often a tickle in the throat, a runny or stuffy nose, and sneezing. Kids with colds may also have a sore throat, cough, headache, mild fever, fatigue, muscle aches, and loss of appetite. Nasal discharge may change from watery to thick yellow or green.

## FARM ANIMALS

What is the difference between cows and cattle?

#### <u>cat·tle n.</u>

1. Any of various chiefly domesticated mammals of the genus Bos, including cows, steers, bulls, and oxen, often raised for meat and dairy products.

2. Humans, especially when viewed contemptuously or as a mob.

#### <u>cow n.</u>

1. The mature female of cattle of the genus Bos.


2. The mature female of other large animals, such as whales, elephants, or moose.

### Facts About Lions

Lions are the second largest big cat species in the world (behind tigers).

The heaviest lion on record weighed an amazing 375 kg (826 lb).

Lions can reach speeds of up to 81 kph (50 mph) but only in short bursts because of a lack of stamina.

The roar of a lion can be heard from 8 kilometers (5.0 miles) away.

Most lions found in the wild live in southern and eastern parts of Africa.

Lions are very social compared to other cat species, often living in prides that feature females, offspring and a few adult males.

Male lions are easy to recognize thanks to their distinctive manes. Males with darker manes are more likely to attract female lions (lionesses).

Lions are the national animal of Albania, Belgium, Bulgaria, England, Ethiopia, Luxembourg, the Netherlands and Singapore.

Lions in the wild live for around 12 years.

When lions breed with tigers the resulting hybrids are known as ligers and tigons. There are also lion and leopard hybrids known as leopons and lion and jaguar hybrids known as jaglions.

In the wild, lions rest for around 20 hours a day.
